

CAMPBELLTOWN GOLF CLUB PENNANTS TEAM 2012



General Information

- The Campbelltown Golf Club Advisory Committee or its delegate will be responsible for rules and selection activities associated with the club's pennant teams. The committee's decision on all pennant matters and activities will be final. The committee will adopt a consultative and collaborative approach when selecting pennant players and managers
- The Advisory Committee will inform members of year's pennant competitions, team formats, fixture dates, club colours & shirt designs, dress standards and a player & caddie code of conduct, as details become known.
- Prior to the selection of the first pennants side, the Advisory Committee will seek and agree on an amount of money that the club will apportion across each of the pennant teams. The agreed budget will be used to cover nomination costs, purchase of team shirts, golf balls and home match catering and refreshments. Team purchases using funds from the approved budget should be made through the Pro shop or from club facilities.
- Teams approved budgets may be supplemented by external sponsorship and team fund raising activities. Any fund raising activities or sponsorship deals sought **must first** be approved by the General Manager & the Advisory Committee. All monies raised through sponsorship and/or fund raising activities must be fully accountable and readily accessible by the club to meet any agreed costs.

Team Selection Process & Criteria

- Expression of Interest (EOI's) for 2012 pennant teams will be advertised by the club at least 6 weeks prior to commencement of each competition. The committee will also monitor player performance throughout the year, including results in the Club Championships, as a way of identifying and informing players where it is felt that may be reaching representative status. This in no way guarantees selection in a pennant team but acts as a method of earmarking potential representative players.
- EOI's will be sought for both playing and a team manager positions.
- Two weeks prior to the selection of the team players the team manager position will be picked and announced by the Advisory Committee. The team manager will act as a single point of reference between the team and the Advisory Committee on all matters relating to the team. The team manager will be responsible, in conjunction with the other team members, in democratically choosing a team captain. The manager can also be a playing member of the team, if selected by the Committee.

- If EOI's are over subscribed a selection process to be adopted. Issues to be considered but not restricted to:
 - Length of membership (i.e. new members)
 - Player performances over the last 12 months
 - Previous form in past pennant games
 - Handicap history
 - Availability to play all games
 - Player conduct

Home Day Fixtures

- The team Manager, Captain and a representative from the Advisory Committee should be on hand to prepare the necessary paper work for the event and get groups away at the appropriate times. All groups will tee off from the competition tees of the day. Any change to tee placements must be done prior to the commencement of the competition of the day.
- Prior to the day (and no later than 5pm the preceding Friday), the team manager will inform the club whether they would prefer a paid half way snack and refreshment **or** move catering to the end of the play. If the team does not inform the club of their requirements in advance, they will run the risk of not having their requests met. Caddies will be included for catering purposes.
- Where teams have additional catering requests, and funds permit, additional food and refreshments can be provided from the teams approved budgets.
- All home day food and refreshments **must** be purchased through the clubs catering and bar facilities.
- A presentation and announcement of results will be conduct by the home club. The Advisory Committee representation will collate the results, fax them to the appropriate bodies and inform the newspaper.

Away Game Fixtures

- Teams will be responsible for making their way to and from fixtures. Club funds must not be used for payment of hired transport arrangements. Where players wish to hire group transport they must do so at their own expense.
- Catering and refreshments for away fixtures will be either provided by the home team or cost will be borne by the players and caddies.
