History of Campbelltown Golf Club

The original golf club was formed in Campbelltown about 1905, with members playing in Rudds paddock at Leumeah. The Club became defunct and in 1926 a new club was formed. The first president was Mr J G Vardy and the first secretary was Mr Fred W Drinkwater.

The Campbelltown Golf Club, as it was called, leased 47 acres of land between the Menangle Roads, and laid down sand greens. Fences had to be erected around these greens for protection as the area was used for stock agistment. Some ten years later an additional ten acres on the southern boundary was also leased and in 1936 bent greens were constructed.

This enlarged area served the club until 1954 when the Campbelltown Municipal Council, assisted by the Cumberland County Council, purchased the land and also an additional 59 acres on the opposite side of the Old Menangle Road. This provided sufficient area for the establishment of an 18 hole golf course. Thanks to the change of ownership, it became possible to remove all fences from around the greens. A small area for the clubhouse site was vested in the Campbelltown Golf Club.

In 1963 it became necessary to relocate the club house, and a site was chosen adjoining Lukes Road overlooking the entire golf course. The clubhouse was officially opened by Mr R J Heffron, M.L.A. the then Premier of New South Wales.

The wheels of progress, having no regard for established areas, dictated relocation. This time a completely new course and clubhouse had to be constructed. The site chosen was adjacent to Menangle Road and adjoining an area now known as Ambarvale. On this site a championship course with fully automatic tee to green watering system was constructed. Play commenced in 1978, and the 1st hole was the 15th hole as we know it now.

In 1982, after three years of playing the "new course" as it became known, it was thought that the hills on the 4th and 5th holes were proving excessive to the members and public players. This necessitated two new holes being built to replace these holes. The sequence of playing the course was altered so that the clubhouse now commands a sweeping view of the 1st and 18th holes.

In 1986 the Pro shop and locker room were enlarged, and in 1996 the extensions were completed on the Top Bar to accommodate growth. 2007 saw the largest change with a complete remodel of the majority of the club to utilise full advantage of the views. To ensure the long term future of the club the Campbelltown Golf Club amalgamated with the Campbelltown Catholic Club in November 2010.

RULES OF THE CLUB

The following Rules relating to Club Members and Visitors shall apply. The Committee may make amendments, which will be duly notified.

1. DRESS

- a. Members and Visitors are required to conform to the standards of dress both on the course and in the clubhouse.
- b. The dress requirements for both the course and clubhouse are displayed in the foyers of the clubhouse. These are subject to change from time to time but members are advised that their standard of dress should always reflect the propriety of the Club to which they belong.
- c. In the absence of the General Manager, the Bar Manager and Bar staff have been directed to ensure that dress standards are maintained in the Clubhouse.

2. HOUSE

- a. The Clubhouse is open for use of members daily, and the Bar hours with variation allowing for trade and special occasions, are: —

Monday to Sunday:

Please see all opening and closing times in the Club Foyer as they are subject to change.

The Clubhouse is closed on Christmas Day.

- b. Members are asked to support the Club by purchasing from the Bar. Club prices are kept competitive at all times.
- c. Social golf parties, trade days, wedding, receptions, birthday parties and social events, are catered for by the Club. Members should make enquiries with the General Manager.
- d. Members and guests under the age of 18 years must comply with the Licensing Laws. Under no circumstance are these members and guests allowed in the restricted areas of the Club.

3. PLAY AND CONDUCT ON THE COURSE

Each member is asked to give close attention to:—

1. The Rules of Golf
 2. The Etiquette of the Game
 3. The Local Rules
 4. The Regulations Governing Conditions of Play
-
- a. All matches are played over 18 holes unless otherwise notified.
 - b. The lowest marker in any group playing on the course is deemed to be responsible for the conduct and etiquette of the group.
 - c. A player, on losing his ball, **MUST** immediately call the players through, and then five minutes only is allowed to look for his ball.
 - d. Players must endeavour to complete holes 1-9 in 2 hours 20 minutes and holes 10-18 in 2 hours.
 - e. Players are obliged to move off the putting green before marking their cards.
 - f. Players are obliged to pick up immediately if they are unable to score in Stableford and Par events.
 - g. Sand buckets must be carried at all times and used to repair divot marks. Failure to do so will result in one warning with subsequent breaches incurring a 2 stroke penalty in the day's event. Pitch marks on greens must also be repaired and bunkers raked after use.
 - h. All play, whether in competition or not, must be from the tees of the day. If there is no competition, play must be from the white markers for men and the red for ladies.
 - i. Should a player or marker be in doubt of the rule of golf or local rule applicable to a particular incident in the course of play, he must immediately upon returning to the clubhouse report the facts to the Captain, Vice Captain or a member of the Match & Greens Committee for a ruling. The card should not be signed until this ruling has been given.

4. VISITORS

- a. Playing visitors shall not, without the sanction of the President, Captain or Vice Captain, be permitted to play on the course during Saturday competition.
- b. A member may not, without the sanction of the President, Captain, or Vice Captain, be permitted to introduce more than one (1) visitor to designated competitions. A member must play in the same group as that visitor.
- c. A member introducing a visitor or guest to the Club:—
 - (i) Must sign the visitor into the Club by entering their name in the Visitors Book on arrival.
 - (ii) Should pay the visitors fee before commencing a game.
- d. A member introducing a visitor shall be responsible for the conduct of the visitor both in the Clubhouse and on the course. Visitors must remain in the company of the member whilst in the Club.
- e. A member shall not knowingly introduce as a visitor any person whose name has been expunged from the Register of Members of the Club, or, who has been refused admission to membership of the Club or any other Club.
- f. For competition purposes, a visitor must be a member of a Club affiliated with the New South Wales Golf Association or similar interstate or overseas association affiliated with the controlling authority.

5. PRIORITY OF THE COURSE

- a. Pairs, threesomes and foursomes shall have precedence over and be entitled to pass any other kind of match. A single player has no standing and shall give way to a match of any kind.
- b. Any match playing a whole round is entitled to pass a match playing a shorter round.

- c. If a match or group fails to keep its place on the course and loses more than one clear hole on the players in front, it should allow the match or group following to pass.

6. LOCAL RULES

- a. Any member may use the course when it is not in use by competition fields or other bookings subject to membership entitlements.
- b. On competition and championship days, no use of the course before the event is permitted for social play without the authority of any member of the Match Committee.
- c. Existing Local Rules and Temporary Local Rules as deemed necessary from time to time will be listed on the Local Rules Board in front of the Golf Shop or at the 1st and 10th tees.
- d. To use the course at any time covered by a competition timesheet, one must be entered in that competition.
- e. Competition fields have priority until the last group has commenced their final nine holes.
- f. Where a tie exists in competition for a Monthly Medal, a play-off will take place on the next Monthly Medal Day. Players in the play-off will use the handicap current on the day of the play off and the lowest nett score shall determine the winner.

7. CHAMPIONSHIPS

The following rules apply specifically, but not only, to championship events:—

- a. Members should inform the Captain or the Match Committee if, following qualification, they do not intend to compete in subsequent championship rounds.

- b. In the event of a tie, a play-off shall be conducted over the number of holes determined by the match committee at a time and date decided by the match committee for scratch scores only. All Nett trophies to be decided on a count back basis.
- c. During championships, all play must take place at designated tee times, where allocated.
- d. Grades for men shall be:—
 - A Grade - Up to 12 handicap
 - B Grade - 13-19 handicap
 - C Grade - 20+ handicap
- e. To be eligible for all Championship events new members must be a financial 7 day member for a **minimum of 6 months and have at least submitted 8 competition cards at Campbelltown Golf Club** prior to the commencement of that Championship.

Note: In Foursomes both players need to be in the same grade or the highest marker adjust his/her handicap to the highest point of the lowest markers grade.

8. TIME SHEETS

- a. Saturday and Sunday timesheets are available from 6.00 p.m. on the Friday evening fourteen (14) days prior to the designated event. Timesheets for Public Holiday competitions will be made available in a similar method to the Sunday sheets. Any one person may enter no more than four (4) names on any timesheet.
- b. Timesheets will be available on the club's website in the member's area. Members can log on with their membership number and personal identification number (PIN) to book into competitions. Restrictions to online bookings may apply for various competition events.

9. **MOTORISED CARTS AND MOTOR BIKES**

- a. Carts and bikes must be driven on designated cart paths at all times, were available.
- b. Carts and bikes must not be driven or left within 10 metres of greens, tees and bunkers.
- c. Players using carts and bikes must maintain their normal place in the field and will have no special priority.
- d. Any motorised cart or bike not owned by the club which is used within the boundaries of the Club must comply with specifications and policy as laid down by the Committee and may not be used without the written consent of the Committee.
- e. Carts may only be driven by a person holding a current drivers licence.

10. **FEES**

- a. Membership fees in various categories may be made half yearly, quarterly or monthly. However, members who elect to pay by instalments are responsible for the payment of the whole of the subscription should they resign.
- b. Any member who intends to resign from the Club shall signify their intention to do so in writing to the General Manager prior to 30th June, or shall remain liable for the subscription for the year.

Note: From 1st of January 2011 if a member leaves the club and later decides to rejoin they will be required to pay a joining fee currently set at \$350. The only way to avoid this is to remain a **Non Playing** member.

11. **COMPETITION CARDS**

- a. A card issued by the starter or other authorised person must be obtained before playing in any competition and the requested competition fee paid. No other card shall be recognised — all cards must be signed by the marker, countersigned by the player and placed in the prescribed

receptacle immediately after completion of the round. All competition cards must be returned for handicap purposes. **Please be reminded that the score card is the official score result of the competition not the score entered into the computer.** The computer is an aid to the Match Committee.

- b. When applicable all cards must be entered into the computer by the player and marker.

12. **PERSONAL PROPERTY AND INSURANCE**

- a. The Club may not be liable for any loss or injury to the property or person of any member or visitor to the Club's premises.
- b. Golf clubs should not be left unattended outside the clubhouse. Valuables should be locked away.
- c. Members should report any incident involving damage or likely damage caused by a ball being hit into private property. This report should be made to the General Manager immediately after a round has been completed. The identity of the person who struck the ball is to be reported.
- d. The security of the lockers and items contained therein is not the responsibility of the Club.

13. **CONTROL OF CARS**

- a. Areas designated for Committee members and others are to be kept vacant for their use.
- b. No car shall be driven on the Club's private roads in excess of a speed of 25 kph, or such lesser speed as shall be indicated in particular areas.

14. **GOLF BALLS**

- a. No member shall purchase golf balls on or in the precincts of the Club's property from any other person than the Club's Golf Shop staff.

15. NEW MEMBERS

- a. It is the responsibility of the “proposer” and “seconded” immediately after the nominee is elected to membership to see that he/she is introduced to other members and is advised of all the pertinent rules of the Club. Above all he/she should be sufficiently advanced in the knowledge of the Rules of Golf to be competent to perform the duty of “marker” to a fellow competitor. Members should play with their nominee until that member is so equipped.

16. LOCKERS

- a. Lockers are provided for members for a fee which shall be reviewed, from by the time, by the General Manager.

17. ADVERTISING

- a. No pamphlet, advertisement or notice of any kind shall be exhibited in the Club without the permission of the General Manager.

18. RAFFLES

- a. No canvassing for donations, raffles or subscriptions is allowed unless approved by the General Manager.

19. REFRESHMENTS

- a. No member shall invite any employee other than an executive officer to partake of liquor or any other kind of refreshments on the Club premises.
- b. Due to licensing laws no alcohol is permitted to be brought onto the course unless it is purchased at the club.
- c. For Occupational Health and Safety reasons no glassware is allowed on the course at any time.

20. COMPLAINTS

- a. All complaints shall be made to the General Manager, and if so required by him shall be in writing. The General Manager shall take all necessary action to satisfy the complaints.

- b. No member shall give any direction to or reprimand any employee of the Club.

21. **GENERAL**

- a. The General Manager shall administer the Rules of the Club at all times. Members are reminded to observe the Rules of the Club at all times.

GOLF COMPETITIONS AND HOW THEY ARE PLAYED

These notes are only intended to assist in the general concept of how various competitions are played. They must be read in conjunction with the Rules of Golf and in particular the Committee shall lay down the conditions under which a competition is to be played (Rule 33-1).

STROKE

The score at each hole is entered on the scorecard, totalled and the player's handicap deducted. The player who completes the stipulated round in the fewest strokes will be the winner.

PAR

In Par play the score is entered on the card in the same way as in stroke play with the exception that where the score exceeds par for the hole, after allowing for handicap stroke (if the player is in receipt of one) the score need not be written in. It is the custom that when a player is beaten by Par, the ball shall be picked up. This helps speed up play.

After entering the stroke score on the card, the result is marked in the column provided with "+" sign for a win, and "0" for half a "-" for a loss. At the end of the round the plus and minus signs are added and the nett result written in as so many "up", "down" or "all square".

A player will play off their full stroke handicap and the strokes are taken at holes as indicated on the card.

STABLEFORD

This system of scoring by points was introduced by Dr. Stableford of the Liverpool Golf Club in 1931 and has become very popular. The popular method of playing a stableford competition is for the player to take strokes at holes as in a Par competition using full handicap and to score points on the nett results at each hole. At the end of the round all points scored are added up and the player having the highest number of points is the winner.

In scoring, without allowing for handicaps, a player who scores par receives 2 points, 1 over par - 1 point, for a birdie or 1 under par - 3 points, for an eagle or 2 under par - 4 points, and so on. For example, a player receiving a stroke on a par 4 hole scores 4 giving a nett 3; and for this he receives 3 points. A player

at a par 3 hole scores a 4 but does not receive a stroke; for this he would receive 1 point.

TWO BALL BEST BALL v. PAR

Two players play as partners each taking strokes at holes as in par competition. If one of the partners wins a hole and the other halves it only the win is counted. If one halves a hole with par and the other loses it only the half is counted and so on. Plus, half and minus signs are added at the end of the round and recorded as in an ordinary par competition.

In a four-ball handicap event care must be taken to mark the scores of each player in separate columns headed by the initials of the player. If the scores are mixed and it is impossible for the Committee to check the card the players will be disqualified.

FOURSOME

Two players play as partners and use one ball. The partners hit off alternately from the tee and thereafter strike the ball alternately during the play at each hole. Scoring is done for a stroke round and the total is subject to a deduction of half the partners' aggregate handicaps.

NOTE: If either player incurs a penalty stroke it does not alter the rotation of play. In a foursome stroke play competition which consists of more than one stipulated round the order of play may be changed between rounds unless the Committee has laid down as a condition of play that the original order of play must be preserved throughout the competition.

All the foregoing competitions are forms of stroke play and subject to the Rules governing stroke play. Special rules for par and stableford competitions are set out in Rule 32. Foursomes may be played under either stroke play rules or match play conditions as set out in Rule 29.

In addition to the competitions listed above many clubs conduct competitions, which are not specifically covered in the Rules of Golf. Some of the more popular types of play are listed below together with suggestions regarding methods of conducting these events.

IT CANNOT BE TOO STRONGLY EMPHASISED HOWEVER, THAT SINCE THESE COMPETITIONS ARE NOT COVERED BY THE RULES OF GOLF, THE CLUB COMMITTEE MUST CAREFULLY LAY DOWN IN ADVANCE AND PUBLISH THE

CONDITIONS OF PLAY. THE RULES AND AMATEUR STATUS COMMITTEE, WILL NOT, EXCEPT IN THE MOST EXCEPTIONAL CIRCUMSTANCES GIVE A DECISION ON ANY QUERY SUBMITTED, WHEN PLAY IS CONDUCTED OTHERWISE THAN IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE RULES.

MIXED FOURSOMES

Mixed foursomes are played in the same manner as foursomes except that the ladies use their own tees and observe their own local rules when it is their turn to play. The Committee should lay down as a condition of play whether the man or lady is required to play from the first tee, and in competitions played under stroke conditions, and consisting of more than one stipulated round, whether this order is to be preserved.

ECLECTIC

Competitors play two or more rounds and the eclectic score is the lowest score obtained at each hole on the rounds. Sometimes the competitions extend over the whole season. The total score for the holes is subject to deduction of $\frac{1}{2}$ the player's handicap held on the last day of competition.

AMBROSE

On every hole, each member of the team is to hit a tee shot. The team then selects one of the tee shots from which to play. All members of the team may then hit from that position. This procedure is repeated until the ball is holed. The position of the selected shot is marked. Each team member may then place their ball within one club length of the marked position, no nearer the hole and play from this position. If the selected shot is on the fairway, the fringe of the green or in a hazard, bunker or rough, the ball must be placed within one club length of the selected shot, no nearer the hole and must remain on the fairway, the fringe of the green or in the hazard, bunker or rough. In a sand bunker, the sand may be raked prior to any ball being placed. The position of the selected putt is marked. Other team members may then place their ball within one putter head length of the marked position. Once the ball is holed out, no further strokes count. Team members may stand behind one another while hitting a shot or putting. The scorecard must show each team member's handicap. These handicaps are to be added together and divided by eight for teams of four and six for teams of three to obtain the Team's handicap.

CANADIAN FOURSOMES

Played with a partner where both players tee off on all holes. They then decide which ball is in the best position and the other ball is taken out of play. If player A hits the selected ball from the tee, then player B will hit the next shot and vice versa. Play continues on an alternate basis until the hole is completed. Incurring a penalty shot does not affect the order of play.

AMERICAN FOURSOMES

Played in the same manner as Canadian Foursomes except that each player shall play their second stroke with their partner's ball before selecting the ball with which to continue the hole on an alternate basis.

HANDICAPS IN USE FOR VARIOUS EVENTS

1. INDIVIDUAL:

- 1.1 Stroke — full handicap.
- 1.2 Par — full handicap.
- 1.3 Stableford — full handicap.
- 1.4 Match Play — full difference of stroke handicaps.

2. FOURSOMES (Incl. Mixed):

- 2.1 Stroke — ½ of aggregate stroke handicap.
- 2.2 Par — ½ of aggregate stroke handicap.
- 2.4 Match Play — ½ of difference of aggregate stroke handicap.

3. CANADIAN / AMERICAN FOURSOMES (Incl. Mixed):

- 3.1 Stroke — ½ of aggregate stroke handicap.
- 3.2 Par — ½ of aggregate stroke handicap.
- 3.3 Stableford — ½ of aggregate stroke handicap.

4. AMBROSE EVENTS:

- 2 Ball 1/4 of combined handicaps.
- 3 Ball 1/6 of combined handicaps.
- 4 Ball 1/8 of combined handicaps.

TIES AND COUNT-BACKS

An Australia-wide uniform count-back system came into operation from the 1st January 1985, a system approved by the Australian Golf Union. Ties in events shall be decided, whenever possible, by play-offs. If the committee considers this to be impractical, the following count-back system shall be used:

18 HOLE EVENTS: The best score for the last nine holes shall be used. If there is still a tie, the last six holes shall be used and, if still tied, the last three holes shall be used. If a tie persists then hole-by-hole scores shall be taken from the 18th hole.

The relevant handicap or fraction thereof shall be applied in handicap events and a penalty applicable under Rule 3-5 (General Penalty) shall be ignored as far as the count-back is applied.

In the event of a tie in any championship event an 18 hole playoff will take place. In the event of a tie in a Monthly Medal, a play-off will take place on the next Monthly Medal Day.

MENS CHAMPIONSHIP AND MAJOR EVENTS

MEMBERS, SENIOR AND JUNIOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Club Championships shall be over 4 stroke rounds - commencing on a date to be notified by the Match & Greens Committee. Grades will be A Grade (up to 12 handicap), B Grade (handicaps 13-19) and C Grade (handicaps of 20+).

The first 3 rounds may be played anytime during the allocated booking times. **The 4th round will be played only by the top 12 players in A, B, & C Grade who will play in a seeded draw from the 1st hole at a time to be determined by the Match & Greens Committee.**

If a player in the top players of any grade becomes unavailable for the seeded draw they will be deemed to have withdrawn from the championship and **will not** be replaced by the next available player.

The Nett trophies will be played over the first 54 holes of the Club Championships.

Junior Championships and Senior Championships are also to be played over the first 54 holes of the Club Championships.

CAMPBELLTOWN CUP

18 Hole Stroke A Grade (Handicap limits apply) event to be held on Saturday 2 July 2011.

CAMPBELLTOWN BOWL AND SALVER

18 Hole Stroke B and C Grade event to be held on Saturday 9 July 2011.

FOURSOMES AND MIXED FOURSOMES CHAMPIONSHIP

36 Hole Stroke play event to be played over two rounds. Mixed Foursomes and Foursomes to be played on a date to be notified by the Match & Greens Committee.

Both partners must be in the applicable grade on the first round of play. Members may play off a lower handicap and compete in a lower grade if desired.

MEDAL OF MEDALS

18 Hole Stroke event to be played on Saturday 5 March 2011. All Monthly Medal winners automatically qualify.

CLUB MATCHPLAY CHAMPIONS

The top 16 of the nominated players in each Grade will qualify after the 2 qualifying rounds to be held at a time to be notified by the Match & Greens Committee.

Matches can be played on or before the nominated date for that match with the exception of the final.

P.J.K. CUP

Presented by R.J. Kitching for 'B' Grade Championship.

A.C.K. HALL SALVER

Donated by the late A.C.K. Hall for 'C' Grade Championship.

E.J. McGOLDRICK CUP

Donated by the late E.J. McGoldrick for Junior Championship.

E.J. BROWNE CUP

Donated by the late E.J. Browne for Foursomes Championship.

L.G. ROUTLEY SHIELD

Presented by L.G. Routley for the Foursomes Handicap, which is played in conjunction with the Foursomes Championships.

'B' GRADE FOURSOMES TROPHY

Presented by L. Hardisty for the 'B' Grade Foursomes Championship.

‘C’ GRADE FOURSOMES TROPHY

Presented by E. Snook for the ‘C’ Grade Foursomes Championship.

MIXED FOURSOMES CUP

Provided by the Club for the Mixed Foursomes Championship.

BALDOCK SHIELD

Presented by F. Baldock for the Mixed Foursomes Handicap, played in conjunction with the Mixed Foursomes Championship.

“COCK OF THE WALK”

Four ball match play, off handicap.

ECLECTIC
